& How to Cope

Guy Fairstein is a lawyer in White Plains, New York. He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree at Williams College, and his Bachelor of Laws degree at the University Of Virginia School Of Law. Guy, an amateur family genealogist and a member of the Westchester County Genealogical Society, applied his genealogical techniques as the court-appointed guardian ad litem in a probate case. He was appointed to represent the interests of ten first cousins of the deceased. He quickly identified five additional "unknown" first cousins, and determined that three of the fifteen were still living. He is a volunteer researcher at Woodlawn Cemetery in the Bronx.

This presentation has derived in large part from the roadblocks he encountered in his searches regarding the "old country" origins and the immigration of his paternal grandparents (Yiddish speaking Russian Jews) and his maternal grandmother and her family (Finnish Lutherans).
